Hi BITS Families -

GAME SCHEDULE:

UNIFORM REMINDERS:

- It is November, and it is going to be chilly tomorrow. Hats and Gloves are permitted; as are sweatshirts and iackets
- ALL HOODS MUST BE TUCKED INTO THE NECK OF THE JERSEY, so that hood cannot be pulled.
- Shinguards must still be worn under pants
- For families that are new to BITS, you do not need to return your uniform; they are yours to keep. You can continue to wear your BITS uniform proudly on spirit days at school!

REFEREES:
